This past week, I, along with the other priests of the Diocese of Madison, had the privilege of attending our annual Presbyteral Assembly. For the first time, we gathered at the beautiful Abbey Resort in Fontana, Wisconsin, located right on the shores of Lake Geneva. In years past, we held this assembly at Chula Vista in Wisconsin Dells, but the new setting was a refreshing change that everyone seemed to enjoy.

We were blessed with two wonderful speakers this year. Fr. Michael Berry, OCD, a Carmelite priest, and Sister Alicia Torres, FE, both offered us profound insights into deepening our spirituality. Fr. Michael gave three talks, each focused on one of the great Carmelite saints: St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, and St. Thérèse of Lisieux. It was inspiring to listen to him speak about how the spirituality of these saints can enrich and shape our lives as priests. Their teachings on prayer, humility, and love resonate deeply in our daily work and offer guidance for drawing closer to God.

In addition to the spiritual talks, I was particularly moved by the opportunity to walk along the shore path

of Lake Geneva on Tuesday afternoon. The path winds close to the stunning homes that line the lake, offering spectacular views of the water and the surrounding



nature. As I walked, I was struck by the beauty of God's creation. The peaceful setting allowed me to reflect on how God's presence can be found in every part of the world, from the vastness of nature to the simple, every-day moments of our lives. I prayed for those who are fortunate to live in such beautiful surroundings, asking that they, too, may recognize God's love and beauty in their lives.

This assembly was a time of renewal for me personally, and I hope to bring the fruits of this experience back to our parish. Please continue to pray for all the priests of our Diocese as we strive to live our calling with faith and joy.


