Dear Parishioners,

I recently spoke with Brianna and Ivan Krejchik, who along with Bryan McCarthy, Roxy Johnson, and Randy and Donna Verges, were instrumental in leading Operation Mercy on Wheels, and I wanted to share some of the incredible stories and successes from their mission to support those affected by Hurricane Helene in North Carolina. Your generosity and support truly made an impact, and I hope this update gives you a sense of the difference they were able to make with your help.

Through your contributions, they were able to deliver over 22,000 pounds of supplies to the community in Black Mountain, North Carolina. Donations ranged from essential items like food, cooking oil, and bedding to specialized supplies like first aid kits and even Tupperware. The support came not just from our pastorate but also from surrounding communities, creating a network of generosity that extended well beyond our expectations.

One particularly touching story involved the Wilderness Resort, which donated several pallets of brand-new comforters, sheets, and blankets. Additionally, they provided two much-needed generators for the relief effort. Brianna shared how her mother, through a connection at St. Cecilia

Parish, reached out to Wilderness, who responded wholeheartedly to our call for help. Their contributions made a significant difference, especially for those who had lost nearly everything.

The donated items were distributed at a "freewill store" set up in a repurposed space in Black Mountain. People affected by the disaster could come and collect whatever they needed, from sleeping bags and clothing to cleaning supplies. It was heartening to see that even amidst devastation, the spirit of community and support

was alive. The store also included shelving units that we brought along—something specifically requested by those managing the site—and these made organizing the items much easier for distribution.

The funds we received—over \$13,000 in total—were used carefully to maximize the impact. They bought additional items like cleaning supplies and other necessities on their way to Black Mountain, and these were put to immediate use. In fact, some of the cleaning supplies were used up within hours of being put on the shelves, underscoring just how dire the needs were.

While in North Carolina, Brianna and Ivan assisted a local medical facility serving patients with dementia and Alzheimer's, many of whom had not yet received any relief. Supplies such as bedding were set aside for this facility, ensur-

ing those most vulnerable had their needs met. They also supported a family who ran a Chinese restaurant but lost everything in their home due to the floods. The gallons of cooking oil we brought were a small but meaningful contribution to help them start to rebuild their lives.

> The devastation in North Carolina was truly overwhelming. Brianna and Ivan shared that they saw entire homes destroyed, roads washed away, and piles of debris left behind. Even in such dire circumstances, the resilience of the community shone through. They were able to attend Mass at a local church in Swannanoa, and it was both a sobering and uplifting experience to hear about the struggles and hope from those directly affected.

> One of the most heart-wrenching aspects of the visit was seeing how many people had no place to go. Many were living in tents, and sad-

ly, a few individuals even lost their lives to hypothermia before we arrived. Despite these challenges, the Operation Mercy on Wheels team, along with other volunteer groups like Savage Freedoms Operations and the Cajun Navy, worked tirelessly to provide as much relief as possible.

None of this would have been possible without your generosity. You have not only provided material goods but also hope and a reminder that, even in the darkest times, we are called to be a light for one another. Please continue to keep the people of Eastern Tennessee and Western North Carolina in your prayers as they begin to rebuild, and know that your kindness has made a world of difference.


FAMILY FAITH FORMATION THIS SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 10





WEEKLY VIRTUES: <u>Building good habits</u>




These last two weeks we've focused on the virtues of MAGNANIMITY and RESPECT!
