

#### Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I am excited to share with you our new logo and visual identity for Mary, Mother of Mercy Pastorate. This milestone represents our growth as a community and our shared devotion to Our Blessed Mother.

#### Our New Logo: A Symbol of Faith and Unity

At the center of our logo, we see Mary's maternal embrace offering refuge to the world, reminding us of her role as our spiritual mother and intercessor.

#### The Immaculate Heart of Mary

Within Mary's figure, we find her Immaculate Heart, symbolizing her great purity and love for God. This heart represents Mary's unwavering "Yes" to the Father's will, her cooperation with her Son's mission, and her openness to the Holy Spirit. It serves as a model for our own spiritual lives, calling us to cultivate purity of heart and steadfast love for God amidst life's challenges.

#### The Crown of Twelve Stars

Surrounding Mary is a crown of twelve stars, drawn from the Book of Revelation. These stars represent both the twelve tribes of Israel and the twelve apostles, uniting

the Old and New Covenants. As Pope Benedict XVI explained, this imagery places Mary at the center of the People of God and symbolizes the Church carrying Christ to the world.

This crown of stars reminds us that while we gather in different church buildings - St. Aloysius, St. Norbert, St. Barnabas, and St. Mary Health of the Sick - we are fundamentally one Church, united under Mary's protective mantle. Like stars forming a constellation, our communities come together as one radiant body of Christ.

#### Logo Variations and Colors

Our new visual identity includes several variations of the logo to suit different needs:

1. **The Full Logo**: This is our primary mark, featuring Mary's embrace, the Immaculate Heart, and the crown of stars, along with our pastorate name. It's available in

full color, using blue (symbolizing Mary's purity), red (representing her Immaculate Heart), and gold (signifying our unity in the Church).

2. **The Stamp**: A more formal version that places the full logo within a circular border, ideal for official documents and communications.

3. **The Icon**: A simplified version featuring just Mary's figure and the Immaculate Heart, perfect for small spaces or as a recognizable symbol on social media.

4. Horizontal and Stacked Versions: Adaptations of the full logo to fit different layout needs while maintaining our visual identity.

Each of these variations is available in different color combinations:

- Full Color: Our primary version, using all three significant colors
- Blue and White: A simpler twocolor version for certain printing needs

- All White: For use on dark backgrounds

- All Black: For use in black-andwhite printing

These options ensure our logo looks its best in any context, from digital media to print materials.

#### A Vision for Our Future

This new visual identity will help unify our communications and create a consistent presence in our community. It serves as a reminder of our mission to be a welcoming community where all can experience God's transformative grace through the sacraments and Mary's example.




