

Best known as Padre Pio, St. Pius was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. As a young boy he suffered many illnesses including typhoid. He joined Capuchin Franciscans at 15 and took the

name of Pius or "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. He was ordained in 1910, and at this time he received the marks of stigmata, the wounds of Christ, but they eventually healed. Frequent illnesses continued to plague him as a young man.

He was assigned to the friary in San Giovanni Rotondo. In 1918, while continuing to serve at the friary, the stigmata appeared again, and this time remained until his death.

Many faithful came to see him at the friary, his days were long, beginning with Mass at 5 a.m. then hearing confessions all day with breaks to bless the sick. A simple man, content to do God's will on earth and with the ardent desire to serve the sick and poor in whom he saw Christ, he urged a hospital, Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza (House for the Relief of Suffering), to be built in San Giovanni Rotondo. It opened in 1956.

Padre Pio died at the age of eighty-one in 1968 and in 2002 Pope John Paul II proclaimed him "St. Pio of Pietrelcina."

New Horizons for

SHORELESS LAKE SCHOOL WISCONSIN

New doors have been opened for Shoreless Lake School Wisconsin (SLSWI) <u>https://www.shorelesslake.school</u> as they move into new headquarters at St. Norbert School, which was built in 1865 by Fr. Adalbert Inama. Although Shoreless Lake School Wisconsin first opened its doors



to students in September 2016, it has a long history. Shoreless Lake School was established in 1991 by the Reverend Alfonso Gálvez, president of the Society of Jesus Christ the Priest (SJCP) with its mission "to form young people after the perfect man, Jesus Christ". After operating for several years in New Jersey, the



school was moved to Spain in 1997, where it continues to receive students in its facility in Totana, Southeastern Spain. The same ideals that inspired Rev. Alfonso Gálvez to establish Shoreless Lake School are now the basis of Shoreless Lake School Wisconsin which is open to formulae and a (12 and malagemen both day students and

is open to females, grades 6-12 and welcomes both day students and boarding students.

Massive renovations were undertaken at St. Norbert School to improve the structural integrity through repairs to the foundation, walls and roof. Outdated electrical, plumbing and Internet infrastructure were upgraded throughout the entire building and classrooms were transformed with new flooring, improved lighting and fresh coats of paint.

The school provides the students with the deepest and most comprehensive education, based on a love for truth, goodness and the beauty of using their talents, skills and intellects in partnership with and a product of love for God.

Shoreless Lake School is the result of a long-cherished dream of the Society of Jesus Christ the Priest: to make available to young people an integral and total formation based on Catholic values and tradition.

The SJCP is responsible for financing the school's operations and the costs for the renovation of St. Norbert School, approximately \$80,000. They are deeply grateful to St. Norbert Parish for their willingness to welcome SLSWI into their school building and their generous contribution of \$6,000 towards the improvements. The enhancements have improved the aesthetic appeal of the space and provided students with a modern learning environment. Perhaps most importantly, they have given the 160 year

old building a new lease on life and ensured that its walls will once again be home to students who are eager to be formed into the perfect

image of Jesus Christ.
