Dear Parishioners,

As we approach Holy Week, the most sacred time in our liturgical calendar, I invite each of you to journey with us through the profound events that lead us to the joy of Easter. This week offers us a unique opportunity

to walk alongside Jesus, to reflect deeply on His Passion, Death, and Resurrection, and to renew our commitment to live as His disciples.



Palm Sunday marks the beginning of our Holy Week observance. We recall Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, greeted by crowds waving palm branches and proclaiming, "Hosanna in the highest!" Yet, even in this celebration, we are reminded of the path that lies ahead—the path to the Cross.

On Holy Thursday, we commemorate the Last Supper, where Jesus instituted the Eucharist and demonstrated the essence of servant leadership by washing the feet of His disciples. This act of humility calls us to serve one another with love and compassion. I encourage you to participate in the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and the solemn adoration that follows.

Good Friday invites us into the solemn remembrance of Jesus' Passion and Death. Through the Veneration of the Cross and the reading of the Passion narrative, we are drawn into the depths of God's sacrificial love for us. Let us take time to reflect on the magnitude of this gift and what it means for our lives.

Holy Saturday leads us to the Easter Vigil, the pinnacle of our liturgical year. In the darkness, we light the Paschal Candle, symbolizing Christ, the Light of the World, dispelling the darkness of sin and death. This night, we also welcome new members into our faith community through the Sacraments of Initiation. I ask you to keep these catechumens and candidates in your prayers as they prepare to fully embrace the Catholic faith.

As we journey through these sacred days, let us open our hearts to the transformative power of the liturgies and allow them to deepen our faith and commitment to Christ. May this Holy Week be a time of profound grace and renewal for each of us.

LENTEN PRAYERS AND PENANCE


