Dear Parishioners,

There is an ancient cloth—a simple linen burial shroud—that has captivated the world for centuries. It bears a faint but striking image of a man who was scourged, beaten, crowned with thorns, and crucified.

This image, inexplicably embedded into the fibers, has been the subject of intense scientific scrutiny and theological reflection. Many believe it to be the burial cloth of Jesus Christ, the very fabric that wrapped His body in the tomb. Others have dismissed it as a clever medieval hoax. But after decades of scientific research, one truth remains: no one can fully explain how the image was formed.



The Shroud of Turin is the most studied artifact in human history. Despite its centuries-old existence, modern technology continues to uncover astonishing details hidden within its fibers—details that perfectly align with the Gospel accounts of Jesus' Passion. The wounds on the image correspond exactly with those suffered by Christ: the scourging, the crown of thorns, the pierced hands and feet, and the deep wound in His side. Even more intriguing, traces of pollen found on the Shroud match flowers that bloom in Jerusalem during Passover, and the limestone dust embedded in the cloth is identical to the rock found in ancient Jewish tombs.

Is this truly the burial cloth of Christ? If not, how was such an image created centuries before photography, in a way no artist has been able to replicate? Could this be God's way of leaving us a visual testimony of His Son's sacrifice?

On Monday, March 10, at 6:00 PM at St. Aloysius School Gym, we have the incredible opportunity to learn more about the Shroud from renowned speaker Tony Cherniawski. His presentation, "Who Do You Say I Am?", will guide us through the latest scientific discoveries, the history of the Shroud, and its connection to the Passion of Christ. A life-size display of the Shroud will also be available for viewing.

I encourage you to join us for this fascinating and faith-deepening event. Whether you come with skepticism or belief, you will leave with a renewed sense of awe at the mysteries that point us to Christ.




