DEAR PARISH FAMILY,

As we begin the process of repairing the water damage to our church, and as a follow-up to Fr. Miguel's article last week, I would like to describe, in a little more detail, what is needed to complete the project. First, we need to replace the gutter and downspout system on the west

side of the church. Also, a drainage system along the foundation of the church needs to be installed. Forming and installing concrete for an ADA compliant ramp is also required as well as plumbing for the installation of a sump crock and pump. And finally, reconstruction of the interior wall and installation of flooring will finish the project. If you are able to supply any of these needs please let Fr. Miguel or myself know. And of course, your prayers and financial support are very much appreciated. Thank you for all who have already contributed and in advance to all who will contribute time and material in the future. 


There are also many Catholic events celebrated this month; but two of


