

Dear Parishioners,

This coming week, most of the priests of the Diocese, including myself, will be gathered in Fontana, Wisconsin for our annual Presbyteral Assembly with Bishop Hying. This is a special time for the priests of the Diocese to come together in prayer, fellowship, and discernment as we reflect on our ministry and grow in communion with one another.

During my absence, a few of my dedicated brother priests will remain in our pastorate to be on call for any needs that may arise. They will also celebrate some of the weekday Masses to ensure that the spiritual life of our parish remains uninterrupted. Please refer to this week's bulletin for the updated Mass schedule.

As we enter the month of October, we are greeted with the vibrant colors of fall, the crispness in the air, and the gentle reminder of God's glory in creation. October is a month of transition, where nature prepares for the winter months by showcasing its final burst of beauty. It's a time to take a moment and reflect on the changing seasons in our own lives, trusting that, just as the leaves fall in preparation for new life, so too does God guide us through every change we encounter.

This month is also rich with the celebration of many saints who inspire us to live our faith more fully. One saint in particular is St. Thérèse of Lisieux, the "Little Flower," whose feast we celebrate on October 1. As we celebrate St. Thérèse this month, let us strive to follow her example by embracing the small acts of love in our lives and trusting in God's plan, even when it seems hidden in the ordinary.

Take time during this beautiful month to enjoy the changing of the seasons and to seek the intercession of the saints, especially St. Thérèse, as we journey together through our own spiritual seasons.


