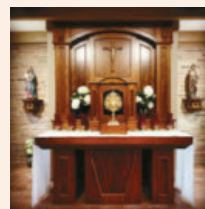

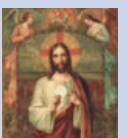


CONSTRUCTION COMING TO ST. NORBERT

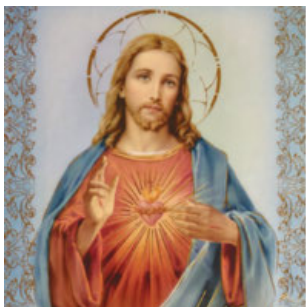

GO MAKE DISCIPLES TIP OF THE MONTH

June is the Catholic month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In 1856 Pope Pius IX designated the Friday (this year it will be June 19th, 2024) following the feast of Corpus Christi as the feast of the Sacred Heart for the universal church. Ever since, the month of June has been devoted to the Sacred



Heart of Jesus and his immense love for us all.

In scripture terms “Sacred Heart of Jesus” denotes the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and his person considered in its most intimate essential: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principal of the salvation and sanctification of mankind. This month think of what you can do to honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus: charity work, extra prayers, helping out a neighbor, friend family member without them asking.

Here is a short Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart: *Sacred Heart of Jesus filled with infinite love, broken by my ingratitude, pierced by my sins, yet loving me still accept the consecration which I make to you, of all that I am and all that I have. Take every faculty of my soul and body, and draw me, day by day, nearer and nearer to your sacred side. There, as I can bear the lesson, teach me your blessed ways. Amen*

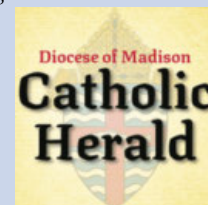




